Seminoles Hang On For Win

In an offensive shootout, the Seminoles bested the Miami Hurricanes last Saturday 34-26. With all the offense, you would think it would be hard to talk about defense, but when it was all on the line in the second half, the defense responded. Daniel Silvestre and Adrian Alcocer led the defense with 7 and 6 tackles respectively. Andres Quezada played awesome at nose guard collecting 5 tackles. Kyle Horton and Donnavan Manabanda each had three tackles each, while DJ Rubalcava had 2. Kenny Peterson had 1 tackle. Nathan Medina, Nathan Fathauer and Ian Beltran kept the passing attack at bay allowing no completions.

The game started off with a 48 yard kickoff return by Daniel Silvestre good for a 6-0 lead. On the next series, Silvestre took the 1st and 10 handoff 25 yards for another score. Ray Martinez added the PAT and the 'Noles had a 14-0 lead. Then the wheel fell off the defensive wagon. The Hurricanes returned the ensuing kickoff for a TD. Both teams traded touchdowns throughout the half.

Kyle Horton had the longest run of the day, a 51 yard burst which ended at the 1 yard line and setup an Adrian Alcocer 1 yard TD run. Horton picked up 85 yards on 7 carries, followed by Silvestre with 44 yards on 7 carries. Alcocer picked up 16 yards on 6 carries, and also caught two passes good for 30 yards from Silvestre. Last minute fullback replacement Donnavan Manabanda picked up 15 yards on 6 carries and scored a touchdown.

Ian Beltran, Victor Rivera and Andres Quezada led did a great job and led all blockers with 11 blocks each. Evan Grey had 9 blocks, while DJ Rubalcava picked up 6 blocks. Hayden Wideman had 5 blocks.

The Seminoles face the Tarheels next Saturday at 10:30 at Russell Park next Saturday.
