Yes, it's time for the Kare Youth League football program. Our young group of Tar Heels battled it out against a strong opponent, but were victorious! The opening drive of the game looked bleak for the Heels, as the Wildcats crashed through our blockers and into the backfield. The Tar Heels turned over on downs and would have to repel the Wildcats' attack. The Cats broke through our defense momentarily, but Aalias Williams (linebacker) and Devyn Cisneros (noseguard) soon began to pounce on the Wildcats and held them off forcing a punt on 4th down.
