CHAMPIONSHIP PREVIEWS '09

C Division - 12:30, U-1 Falcons (5-4) vs. Wildcats (3-3-2)

Outlook: Both squads scored upset wins in the playoffs to set up this unlikely championship match up. The Falcons, on a three-game win streak, look to become the first team from Upland to win a football championship.

Players to watch: The Falcons feature a trio of running backs in QB/FB Hector Valdez (9.0 ypc) and tailbacks Dominic Ferrel (8.0 ypc) and Nathan Camacho (10.0 ypc). Safety Matthew Gonzalez leads the team in tackles with 31, while nose guard Donavan Settles is a force up front.

Wildcat linemen Rogelio Sanchez and Austin Taylor pave the way for QB Ivan Ostry (10.0 ypc, 4 TDs) and tailback Thomas Gleason (12.0 ypc, 6 TDs). End Vincent Rodriguez leads the team in tackles with 28.

C/B Division - 1:30, C-1 FSU (6-2) vs. Georgia (5-3)

Outlook: The Seminoles won all three match ups in the regular season handing the Bulldogs all three of their losses, but Georgia is on a four-game win streak.

Players to watch: The favored Seminoles are led on offense by running back Zachery Vasquez (9.0 ypc) and Jonathan Bordey (19 points). Brett Appleby recorded the longest run of the season. Gabriel Vergara is the team's leading tackler with 28 on the season.

Bulldog brothers Rafael and Rocky Velasco lead the Georgia defense. On offense the Bulldogs run behind offensive lineman Peter Schubert. Zachariah Cano is Georgia's top offensive threat.

B Division - 3:00, C-1 UNC (8-0) vs. Kentucky (4-3-1)

Outlook: The Tar Heels look to finish the season as KYL's only unbeaten and untied team. They won both prior matchups with the Wildcats including a 20-0 win in their last meeting.

Players to watch: UNC looks to repeat as champs behind the play of QB Nick Cuda (8.7 ypc, 9 TDs). O-linemen Jacob Lyons, Evan Wilson, Josh Mora and Robby Reyes set the tone up front. On defense the 'Heels are led by nose Devyn Cisneros (41 tackles), linebacker Billy Hennessy (26 tackles) and end Alias Williams (23 tackles).

The Wildcats are led by the backfield trio of Leville Slayton, Eddie Perez and Kenneth Lee - all of whom average over five yards per carry. Defensive end Robert DeLaPena is the team's leading tackler with 24. Kicker Nathaniel Kahrs is a perfect 3-for-3 on kicked PATs.

Outlook: The Tar Heels cruised in their playoff win, while the Bulldogs won in double OT. UNC won both prior meetings, but the Bulldogs may be more battle tested.

Players to watch: The backfield tandem of Matt Hoskins (8.8 ypc, 9 TDs) and Tylar Rickard (6.9 ypc, 2 TDs) run behind the solid line play of Isaac Ibarra, Deandre Walter and Mitch Benavides on an offense that averages 18 points per game. QB Dan Vasquez runs the show and has completed 50% of his passes on the season. Defensive end Aaron Perez leads the team in tackles with 49.

The Bulldogs will look to a stout defense to try and slow down UNC. leading tacklers on the season are DE Kevin Bullock (68), LB Dillon Gadoury (44), and DE Richard Sanchez (38). Tailback Todd Do averages 5.5 ypc and has scored 5 TDs.

A/AA Division - 12:30, C-2 UNC (5-2) vs. Falcons (4-3)

Outlook: The Tar Heels won both prior meetings, but the Falcons are hot of late and offer Upland's best chance at winning their first football title.

Players to watch: UNC Offensive linemen Andrew Garcia, Luis Sanchez and Jacob Lozano pave the way for leading ground gainers QB Manuel Valenzuela (5.1 ypc, 3 Tds) and tailback Matt Joe (7.9 ypc, 1 TD). MLB Mike Ozuna is the leader of the defense and has posted 15 tackles on the season.

The Falcons are led by the dynamic quarterback play of Kenzel Lawler who has rushed for 543 yards and 16 touchdowns. Lawler's favorite targets in the pass game are receivers Matthew Vieau and Jess Becerril. O-linemen Luis Sanchez and Eddie Lara make it all possible with their stellar play up front.

AA Division - 5:00, A-1 - Friday FSU (6-0-1) vs. Georgia (4-3-1)

Outlook: The Bulldogs are responsible for the only blemish (a 12-12 tie late in the season) on FSU's otherwise perfect four-year undefeated run in football.

Players to watch: QB Matt Avila leads the Seminole offense and has thrown four TD passes - two to WR Noah Rodriguez. The offensive line has been solid all season and is paced by TE Aaron McCraven and guard Alex Alvarez. Leading tacklers for the 'Nole defense (allowing just 7.0 ppg) are end Raymond Serrano (38), LB Steven Comstock (36), and LB Joseph Romero (33).

The backfield tandem of Rory Hare (5.8 ypc, 2 TDs) and Damian Valenzuela (6.3 ypc, 2 TDs) run behind a determined O-line led by tackles Martin Keeley and Ethan Nishikawa. Linebacker Nick Carrillo leads the team in tackles with 36.

Players to watch: FSU averages 23 points per game thanks in large part to the line play of Evan Gray, Joshua Griffin and Noah Guzman. FSU's backfield of QB Adrian Ponce (6.7 ypc, 11 TDs), FB Zach Brickner (9.4 ypc, 9 TDs) and TB Michael Ezpinoza (9.9 ypc, 4 TDs) have been the beneficieries. Top tacklers for the 'Noles include NG Francisco Carcamo (32 & 4 sacks), LB Luke Evans (35) and CB Garrett Moreland (32).

The Mendez twins are Georgia's top play-makers on offense both averaging better than seven yards per carry and combining for 12 TDs. O-linemen Edward Masuda, Craig Carillo and Jacob Rodriguez are a force up front. LBs Nick Flores (27) and Willie Calvillo (36) lead the team in tackles.

Pacing the offense are O-linemen Lopaka Moore-Sanchez, Blake Downing, Ray Martinez and Eric Escobar. Leading tacklers for the Trojans are Chris Salcido (53 & 4 INTs), LB Joseph Cervantes (52) and LB Daniel Silvestre (35).

UCLA is led by QB Thomas Chavez who has rushed for 570 yards, passed for 102 and accounted for 15 TDs. Victor Rivera is the Bruins' top offensive lineman and MLB Jose Valazco the team's top defensive player (49 tackles, 2 sacks). Kicker Rogelio Serrano is 14-of-20 on PATs.
