The Tar Heels upset the Wildcats to get their first victory of the season. The Heels scored their only touchdown of the game on the opening kickoff. Matthew Armas scooped up the payload on our own goal line and stormed up the sideline on a record breaking 40 yard kickoff return. The Tar Heels executed their first extra point field goal of the season to give the Heels an 8-0 lead. Shane Irwin held the ball on the tee as Rainn Pollock blasted it through the uprights. It was an incredible moment as the fans went wild! The Heels defense was running on all cylinders as they held the line time after time against Kentucky's attack. Linebacker, Rainn Pollock, lead the team with 12 tackles. Cornerbacks, Nicholas Ulloa and Shane Irwin, combined for another 8. The Heels stopped the Wildcat's first series and took over on downs on our own 15 yard line. But Kentucky's defense was strong, holding the Heels to only two yards after four downs.
