## TAR HEELS OFF TO A GREAT START

The mighty Tar Heel Cs opened up the season with a big win over the Seminoles in last Saturday's Russell Park matchup. Matthew Guerrero opened things up with a huge 25 yard return on the opening kickoff to give the Heels the lead, followed by Mehki Austin's sweep around the right to complete the extra point. The Heels stopped the Seminoles on their first offensive series and quickly took over on downs. This time it was Shaun Lewis who trucked his way up the middle on a dive right, scoring on a huge 30 yard touchdown. Lucas Walter almost connected with Caleb Cantu on a QB Fly Pass, but would fall short and the Heels were up 13-0.

The Heels looked good defensively as well.

Linebacker Shaun Lewis spearheaded the defensive campaign with 6 big tackles. Erick Rosales, Caleb Cantu and Jacob Ayala picked up 4 tackles a piece, followed by Max Alvarado, Mehki Austin, Cole Armas, Benn Bass, Reilly Whitter and Lucas Walter accounting for the other 8 tackles.

Guerrero blasted a huge 25 yard kickoff into the endzone to start the second half. The Seminoles came back with a vengeance in the second half scoring on third and long. They completed their extra point and were kicking at our heels... but our boys once again showed what being a Tar Heel was all about! QB Reilly Whitter found Erick Rosales on an X-25 who then squeezed through the Seminole blockade and raced down the field into the endzone for another 6 points. Benn Bass cruised around the end on a two yarder, falling just short of the endzone on the extra point attempt.

The Seminoles refused to give up. Cantu, Alvarado and Guerrero made some great plays, but eventually FSU marched across the goal line and kicked it over the uprights making the score 19-15 in favor of the Tar Heels with just under two minutes to play. The Seminole pounded into our backfield trying to recover the ball, but the Tar Heel Blocking Brigade was just too much for the Seminoles. Congratulations on a great victory boys!
