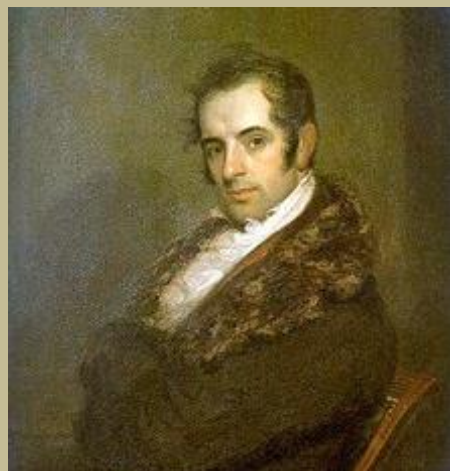

A Tale of Two Men – Part Two

World War II produced many heroes. One such man was Lieutenant Commander Butch O'Hare. He was a fighter pilot assigned to the aircraft carrier Lexington in the South Pacific. One day his entire squadron was sent on a mission. After he was airborne, he looked at his fuel gauge and realized that someone had forgotten to top off his fuel tank. He would not be able to complete his mission so his flight leader told him to return to the carrier.

Reluctantly, he dropped out of formation and headed back to the fleet. As he was returning to the mother ship he saw a squadron of Japanese aircraft speeding its way toward the defenseless American fleet. He couldn't reach his squadron and bring them back in time to save the fleet. There was only one thing to do. He must somehow divert them.

Laying aside all thoughts of personal safety, he dove into the formation of Japanese planes. Butch wove in and out of the Japanese formation and fired at as many planes as possible until all his ammunition was gone. Undaunted, he dove at the planes, trying to clip a wing or tail in hopes of damaging as many enemy aircraft as possible and rendering them unfit to fly. Finally, the exasperated Japanese squadron took off in another direction.

Butch O'Hare and his tattered fighter limped back to the carrier. Upon arrival, he reported in and related the event surrounding his return. The film from the gun-camera mounted on his plane told the tale. It showed the extent of Butch's daring attempt to protect his fleet.

He had, in fact, destroyed five enemy aircraft. For his bravery Butch became the first naval aviator to win the Congressional Medal of Honor. A year later Butch was killed in aerial combat at the age of 29.

Today, O'Hare Airport in Chicago is named in tribute to the courage of this great man. So, what do this story and last week's story have to do with each other? Butch O'Hare was "Easy Eddie's" son. I guess courage and sacrifice run in the family.
